BRITAIN_
There are several names for Britain: Britain, Great Britain, the United (1), the UK. The official name is the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern (2) A lot of people call the country "England", but this is not (3) England is only one part of the UK. However, it is the (4) part. There are four "countries" in the UK – England, (5), Wales and Northern Ireland. London is the (6) of the UK, as well as England, but all the countries have their own smaller capital cities, too.
